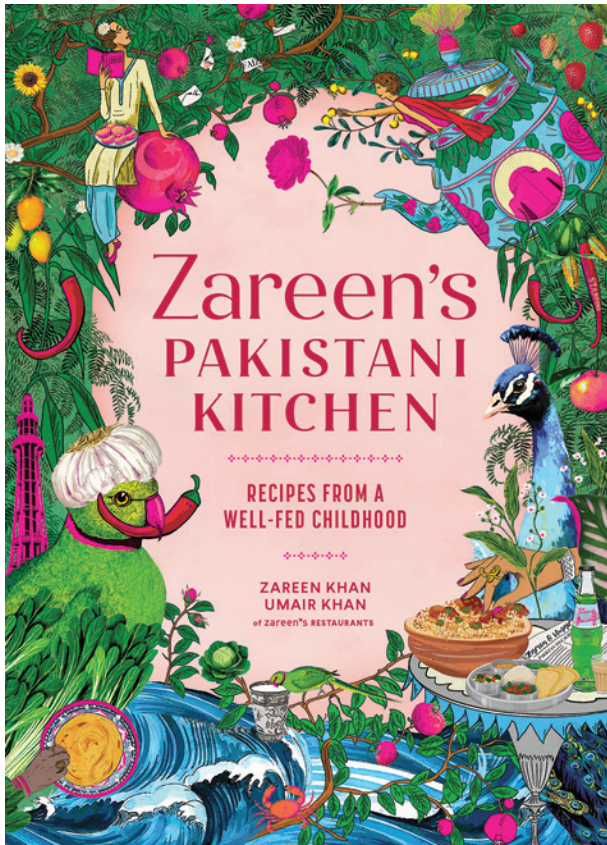

Choosing a Pizza Cooker: Grill or Oven

GRILLS AND PIZZA OVENS
 The goal of this section is to make sure we can meet you with the grill or pizza cooker you have, so the idea is to provide some additional specifics on how we set up and bake our pizzas on the most common types of grills and pizza ovens. From there, you can use the recipes in this book to make each type of pizza based on your setup.
 If you want more details on the pros and cons of each grill and pizza oven, we have many articles on our website.

DOHE VS STONE TEMPERATURE

Whenever we mention a dome thermometer temperature, as on a kettle grill or kamado, we are referring to the reading on the thermometer built into the lid of the grill. The dome temperature is not going to be the same as the stone temperature. This is why we mention the approximate temperature of the dome thermometer as well as the stone or steel temperature.
 The most important temperature to follow when making pizza is that of the pizza stone, not the dome thermometer.



MARGHERITA

This is the queen of pizzas and the first one we make together on these pages. It's the backbone of a good pizza and a great one to get you to understand up-broiler and high-heat cooking, even when you're using a charcoal grill. It's also a great one to get you off to a good start.

- Preheat your pizza cooker to the target temperature per the instructions on page 10 through 14.
- Place the dough on a round 18" pizza stone and flatten surface, following the instructions on page 85.
- Apply the prepared toppings in the order presented.
- Spread the sauce evenly over the dough to reach 1 inch of the rim. Then top with the cheese and the toppings.
- Transfer the pizza to your pizza peel and bake per the instructions on pages 26 through 34.
- After removing pizza to a cooling rack, cut into wedges and serve warm.

NOTE: If you want to add to the top before the toppings, be sure your oven is hot to the stone and the toppings are evenly distributed around the pizza. Drizzle with olive oil before cooking.

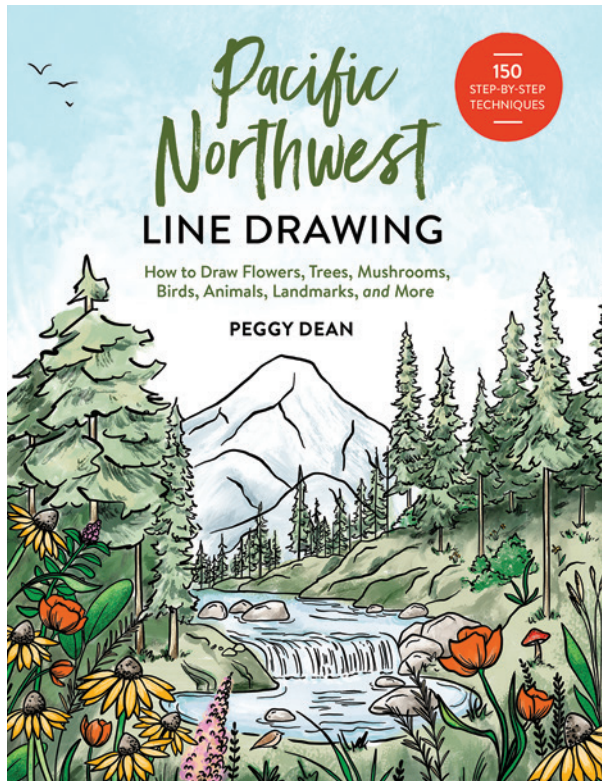

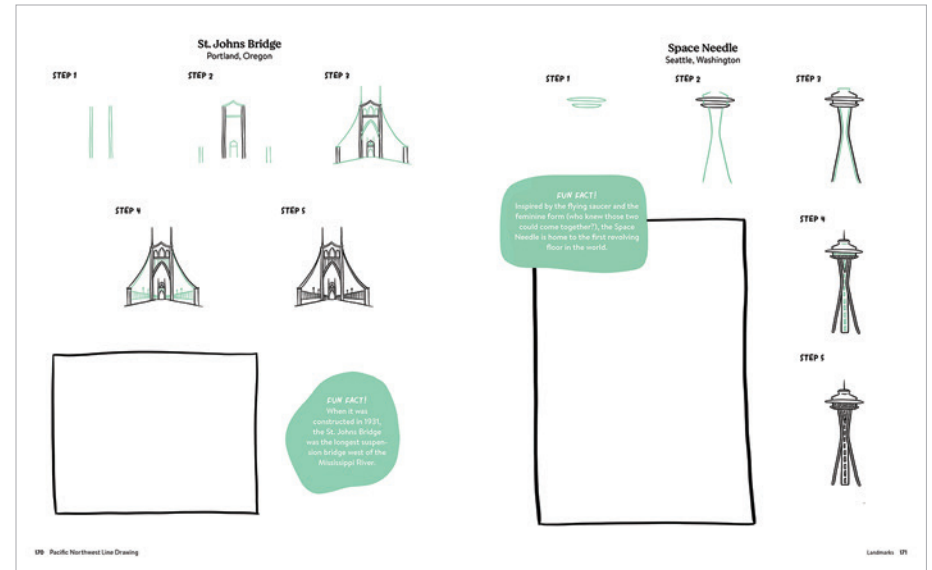

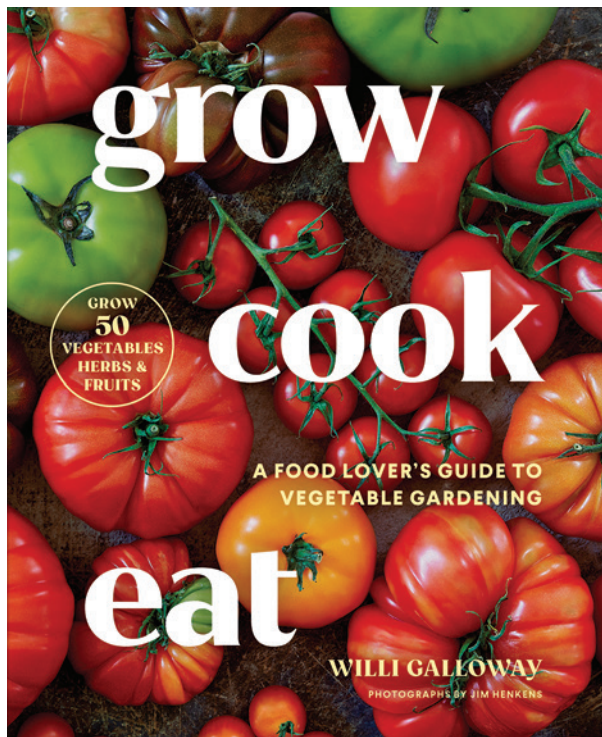

Nona's Pesto

MAKES ABOUT 2 CUPS

3 plump garlic cloves,
peeled
1/2 cup pine nuts
4 cups packed fresh basil
leaves
1/2 cup packed finely
grated Parmesan (about
1 pound)
1/2 cup extra-virgin olive oil
Sea salt

My grandmother Inez was born in a western Wyoming coal-mining town to immigrants from southern Italy. Italian was her first language, and she learned to cook on a wood-burning stove. This heirloom recipe comes straight from her kitchen. I make it all summer long and freeze several batches for the winter. Use the proportions in this recipe as a baseline and experiment by substituting different greens and herbs (such as parsley, cilantro, arugula, and fava or radish greens) and using different nuts, especially walnuts, and sunflower or toasted squash seeds.

Pulse the garlic and pine nuts in a food processor until finely chopped. Add the basil and Parmesan and process into a smooth paste. Scrape down the sides of the bowl. With the blade running, slowly drizzle in the olive oil. Process until the oil is thoroughly incorporated and the pesto is smooth. Taste and add salt if desired.

To keep refrigerated pesto from turning black, lay plastic wrap coated with olive oil directly over it, and seal the container with a lid. It will keep for at least a week refrigerated and several months frozen. Bring it to room temperature and stir thoroughly before using. When using frozen pesto in pasta, thaw it and stir in 1 tablespoon pasta water before tossing with cooked pasta—this helps distribute pesto evenly.

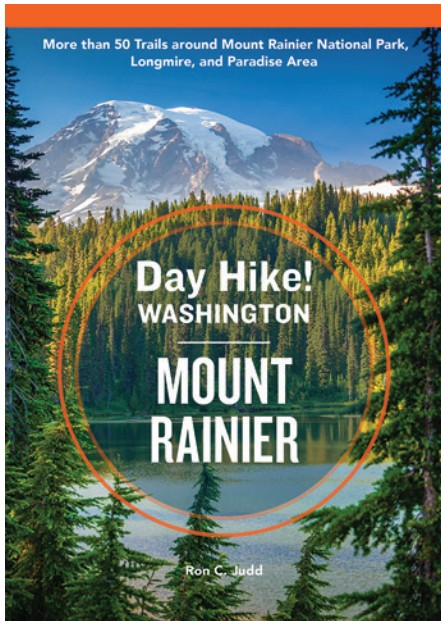

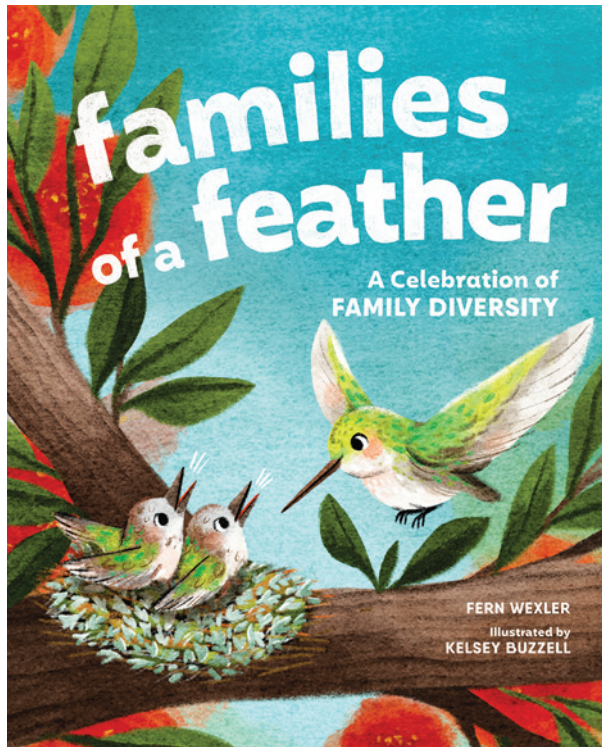

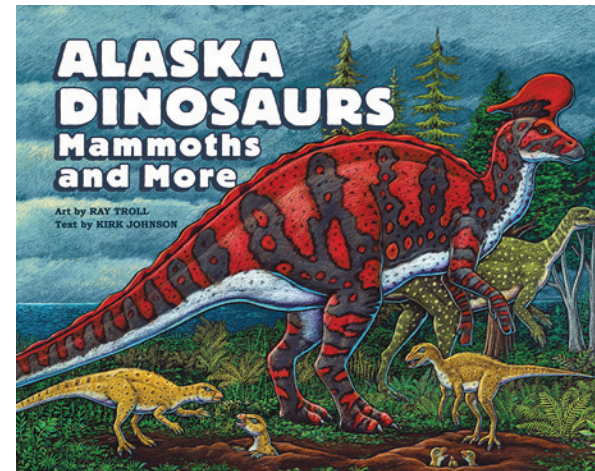

ALASKA DINOSAURS, MAMMOTHS, AND MORE

- *Alaskacephale*, whose almost entirely solid, bowling ball-shaped skulls probably allowed them to butt heads like modern-day bighorn sheep

KIRK R. JOHNSON is a paleobotanist and the Sant Director of the Smithsonian's National Museum of Natural History in Washington, D.C. He is the host of four recent PBS series, *Making North America*, *The Great Yellowstone Thaw*, *Polar Extremes*, and *Ice Age Footprints*.
