


### CREATE YOUR OWN STORY



Get ready to let your imagination soar! Follow these simple steps to cut, arrange, and create your very own story:


#### What You'll Need

- If you prefer telling stories, practice sharing your tale aloud with classmates, friends, or family!










# COLORING PAGES




Garibaldi fish live in forests of seaweed, called kelp.



Sea otters feed on sea urchins near the shoreline.



**Basking sharks** grow to 25 feet long. They feed on tiny animals, called zooplankton, as they swim.



Yellowfin tuna are fast, powerful predators.



Japanese divers collected **abalone**, a kind of shellfish, in shallow waters.



**Flying fish** escape predators, such as the **mahi-mahi**, by leaping from the water and gliding on long, wing-like fins.
